St. Augustine Youth Services is Observing April National Child Abuse Prevention Month with Three Events

April is National Child Abuse Prevention Month and since 1989, people nationwide wear the blue ribbon (and now carry blue pinwheels) in April to create awareness of the need to keep kids safe and families strong.

St. Augustine Youth Services (SAYS) is hosting three events in April to bring this message to our community by encouraging parents to have the knowledge, skills and resources they need to care for their children.

The first event is the "Pinwheel Parade" March against Child Abuse on April 5th at the SAYS campus from 10:00-11:30am. There will be a ceremonial "parade" around the campus, free children's activities including a bounce-house and face painting plus tables set up with parenting information and people on hand to answer questions about the resources available in St. Johns County. SAYS is located on US1 South, next to the SE Branch Library, near SR206.

Next on April 12, SAYS is dropping 1,000 numbered golf balls from a helicopter onto the replica 17th green at World Golf Village. The owner of the ball that goes in first, or is closest to the pin will win a \$1,500 cash prize.
